- (:) Condom is the ONLY contraceptive measure that prevent BOTH pregnancy & STDs including HIV/ AIDs
- Convenient and easy to buy
- (:) Not suitable for people with latex allergy (For condoms made of latex)

Oral pills



• Women can initiate their use

- \odot Can be stopped at any time
- \bigcirc May not be suitable for everyone

(i.e. women with severe hypertension, diabetes with complications. heart disease, on breastfeeding, smokers >35 years old, etc.)

There are 2 types of oral pills:

- **Progestogen Only Pills** (POP)
- Combined Oral
- Contraceptives (COC)
- Do not protect against STDs
- Consult doctors before taking the pills.
- The pill should be taken at the same time every day.

Emergency Contraception

Emergency contraception can prevent pregnancy after unprotected sex, missing your pills, or if you had a contraceptive accident such as broken condom. It should not be used routinely as it is less effective than other regular contraceptives. They do not protect against STDs.

Emergency Contraceptive Pills



Should be taken as soon as possible after unprotected sex (within 72 - 120 hours)

Copper Intra-uterine Device

Insert within 5 days of unprotected sex

*Emergency contraceptive services are offered during opening hours among all MCHCs. Outside MCHCs' opening hours, you may attend A&E, FPA, or private hospitals/clinics

Subfertility



- Difficulties in becoming pregnant despite having regular sex when not using contraception after 1 year
- Affecting 1 in every 6 couples
- Treatment success rate 1 remarkably with female age
